




From the Mountains to the Sea

Tour code: HKS1

Sardinia is an inspirational island, full of natural beauty and a mixture of Italian and Spanish cultures. Walking from the black mountains of Montiferru to the sea and the Sinis wetlands you will discover beaches, bays, headlands, ancient ruins and historical sites along the way. This is a gentle self-guided point to point hotel based walk embracing the wild and romantic beauty of Western Sardinia, through areas of scented Mediterranean maquis, crossing a wide variety of terrain. The Sinis is a nature reserve home to thousands of pink flamingos and a wealth of other birdlife especially in the spring. It is a remarkable example of how low impact fishing activity can co-exist without damaging the local environment. On the walks you are rewarded with some dramatic views and opportunities to explore highlands, lowlands and coastlines. The route is very quiet - far removed from the busy resorts, the terrain is rugged in parts, with cliffs on the coast, interspersed with white sand beaches, grass covered dunes and panoramas embracing the coast and seaside blues. To aid your enjoyment we have found some very charming accommodation to make this tour more memorable.

We start with a couple of nights high in the Montiferru mountains, a basaltic area famous for the green forests, clear spring water and local 'red' beef. Our base is amongst the centuries old narrow streets of Santulussurgiu, which wrap around the head of the valley and descend the steep hillside. From this mass of winding streets a short day walk takes you to the springs of S. Leonardo where you can 'take the waters', visit the village church and patronise one of the cafes or restaurants. Walk back via the view point above Santulussurgiu and back to our rather special accommodation and dining in Santulussurgiu where the date above the door reads 1837, the date of renovation not construction. The longest day walk takes you all the way from the top of the mountains to the coast; it is all downhill and on good tracks. This is a day of sweeping views and a sense of accomplishment as you arrive at your hotel



overlooking the bay of Santa Caterina di Pittinuri where you can sit by the pool with a well deserved drink and watch the sunset turn the limestone cliffs to shades of yellow and pink. There is a free morning in Santa Caterina for relaxing by the pool or on the beach. Alternatively you can take a short walk to the neighbouring village/beach at S'Archittu and perhaps swim through the rock arch. At midday you are transported to the edge of the 'Is Arenas' forest to start walking past the 'Is Benas' lagoon home to large colonies of Grey Herons and pink Flamingos during the migration season. A beautiful cliff top walk leads us to the beach of Su Pallosu and on to the cliffs leading to 'Capo Mannu', the lighthouse and ancient Spanish watchtowers. Then stroll into Putzu Idu, a village popular with sailors and the surfing fraternity before looping back to your hotel.

A short transfer to the cliffs at Su Tingiosu home to plenty of bird life in the spring, especially where the cliffs end at the beautiful quartz beaches of 'Is Aruttas' and 'Mari Ermi'. Here the white sand comprises of rice-sized grains of quartz. There are plenty of beach front cafes along this stretch for



refreshments before heading inland, crossing low hills of arable land, to arrive in San Salvatore Sinis. This village is populated for just one week a year for a religious festival at its church erected over a hypogeum (ancient subterranean structure). The population of nearby Cabras follow an old tradition of congregating here at the beginning of September every year. The village is reminiscent of a deserted spaghetti western set and has indeed been used as such. A nearby hotel with a fine restaurant is home for two nights and our starting point for a loop to the ancient ruins of Tharros and Capo S. Marco. Not far to walk but much of interest along the way including the ancient Basilica Paleocristiana di San Giovanni di Sinis V Secolo, a church dating back to 470AD, and a choice of restaurants for a nice lunch. The site of Tharros has evidence of occupation from the 8th century BC through to

the 10th century AD, by Phoenicians, Punics and Romans. There is an entrance fee, information leaflets and a café. The walk round Capo S. Marco passes some small secluded beaches, old watch towers, cliffs and a lighthouse before ending on a larger sandy beach.

From San Salvatore we walk to Cabras, the main town in the Sinis. The route crosses artichoke fields, Vernaccia (white wine) vineyards, olive groves and the Cabras Lagoon, famous for the grey mullets and its 'Bottarga', the cured mullet roe. The natural reserve is rich in birdlife. In the afternoon you can walk a loop from Cabras across the 'Pauli 'e Sali' swamp, a protected area where an immense number of birds usually nest. Sheltered by the bank grasses and canes you can take beautiful pictures without disturbing them. Cabras is a small town with an attractive compact centre with bars and restaurants for your last meal of the trip.

Itinerary

Day 1: Arrival at our hotel in Santulussurgiu.

Day 2: Santulussurgiu / San Leonardo Circuit (12 km, ascent 300m). A short walk to start the holiday so have a relaxing breakfast before setting out but beware it is not all plain sailing with 300m of ascent along the way. A mix of road walking and agricultural tracks take you up to San Leonardo with sweeping views on the way. Spend a little time looking around this village, the church and springs are interesting and Sunday is market day. There are numerous places to get a drink and something to eat. Another mix of road walking, tracks and paths will get you back to Santulussurgiu. You will have time to divert to the viewpoint above the town where a statue of Christ overlooks the village and to walk down through the maze of narrow streets to look at the churches and find the bar at the center of the village for well-earned refreshment.

Day 3: Santulussurgiu – Santa Caterina di Pittinuri (22 km, ascent 100m). First hop into a taxi for a short ride to the top of the mountain and the start of the walk. The route descends from the Montiferru Mountains, to Santa Caterina di Pittinuri located on the coast. The route initially traverses the high ground with views down to the coast then descends to the coastal plain. Most of the way is on good tracks with gentle gradients passing through oak forests, olive groves and quiet pastures. The last hour is on level minor roads taking you to the quiet bay at Santa Caterina.

Day 4: Santa Caterina di Pittinuri – Putzu Idu (16 km, ascent 50m). Walking starts after a short taxi ride (pick up at 09:00) and we soon find the Is Benas lagoon, home to a large colony of Grey Herons and Pink Flamingos in season. A beautiful track winds along the cliffs leading to the beach of Su Pallosu where a stroll across the sand ends at the hotel. But this only takes 2 or 3 hours so onwards the route goes to complete a loop around Capo Mannu. This takes you along more cliff tops to the lighthouse and the ancient Spanish watchtowers. After Putzu Idu, a village located on a stretch of coast often frequented by sailors and surfers, we get to our hotel

Day 5: Putzu Idu – San Salvatore Sinis (20 km, ascent 65m)

The day starts with a walk along the limestone cliffs of Su Tingiosu, which stretch for 6 km and provide habitat for many birds. The cliffs end in the beautiful quartz beaches of Is Aruttas and Mari Ermi where rice-sized grains of quartz form the white beaches. Finally head inland, crossing artichoke and wheat fields to arrive in San Salvatore Sinis, famous for its church erected over a Roman hypogeum – or underground temple. The village is unpopulated apart from one week when a religious festival brings the place to life.

Day 6: Tharros and Capo S. Marco (16,5 km, ascent 130m)

A day trip walking across fields and by the side of the lagoon to San Giovanni, on to the site of Tharros and the narrow peninsular of Capo S. Marco. A leisurely hours walk takes you from the hotel to the ancient Basilica Paleocristiana di San Giovanni di Sinis, a church dating back to 470AD. Here you join the main tourist track to the site of Tharros an interesting site dating back to the 8th century BC but most dominant are the Roman remains. An hour here and a stop in the café will set you right for a loop around the Capo S Marco using the smaller footpaths that skirt the coastline. Pass the watchtower before walking



along the beach and back to the cafes and restaurants of San Giovanni. You can spend the rest of the afternoon relaxing on the beach, walking further along the coast or just head back (by the same path used in the morning) to the hotel.

Day 7: San Salvatore Sinis – Cabras (9 km, ascent 20m) and Bird watching from Cabras (loop up to 9 km, ascent 10m)

A morning walk leads you out of San Salvatore to Cabras, main town of the Sinis. During the itinerary you walk along artichoke fields, Vernaccia grape vineyards, olive groves and past the Cabras Lagoon, the largest in the area, famous for the grey mullets and above all its Bottarga, the cured roe of mullet. Don't miss the fresh fish, the Bottarga and the Vernaccia wine, you could even try them for lunch! However if you are passionate about birdwatching don't spend too long over lunch, as today is your day! Take the optional afternoon walk crossing the swamp of Pauli 'e Sali, a protected area where an immense number of birds (some are very rare) usually nest. Sheltered by the canes you can take beautiful pictures without disturbing them.

Day 8: Departure day

Tour ends after breakfast.

Level of Difficulty

This tour is graded Easy – Moderate. The terrain is generally easy being on tracks and good footpaths with walking times of between 3 and 6 hours per day. The longest day (day 3) is mainly downhill on tracks and back roads. There is a little flexibility on a few days to adjust the distance walked.

There is no waymarking and the maps are not as clear as Ordnance Survey maps but the maps provided when used with the detailed route notes supplied make route finding quite easy.

Maps & Route Notes

We provide detailed route notes and highlighted maps of all the suggested walks.

General Information

Hotels: The hotels described are our usual choice of accommodation, however if these are not available then alternatives are used and if these are of a different standard you will be informed at the time of booking.

Baths/showers: Many rooms with ensuite/private facilities have a shower rather than a bath, usually because of limited space.

Breakfast: in Sardinia is usually a cold buffet arrangement, with a selection of coffee/tea and pastries/ cake/ biscuits/ bread, jams, hams, cheeses, eggs, yoghurts and fruits.

Special Dietary Requirements: It is important for you to tell us if you have any dietary requirements when you book your holiday so that we can inform everyone that you are staying with.

Language: When travelling in less frequented areas you will not necessarily come across people speaking English. Remember you are experiencing a different culture, buy a phrase book and try to learn a little of the local language!

Transfer during tour: on days 3 and 4 a taxi will pick you up from the hotel at h09:00 with your luggage, to take you to the walk starting point.

Luggage: When staying in hotels, sometimes your luggage will have been taken to your room awaiting your arrival. However don't be surprised if your luggage is waiting for you to take it up to your room. Please politely ask someone if you need assistance.

Route Notes: Please note that one set of route notes per room booked is included in the cost of the holiday.

Insurance: All clients must have appropriate cover for the activities included for the duration of our trip.

Accommodation

Note that the descriptions of overnight stops and the itinerary is the usual schedule of the holiday, however we do occasionally need to change places that we use when our chosen hotels are full. This is particularly the case with "late" bookings.

We believe that the accommodation is a very important factor of a hiking tour, therefore we take the greatest care in carefully selecting small family-run 3 and 4* hotels and country lodges with excellent regional cuisine. In these places we hope it will feel like home.

The term "Albergo diffuso", literally "spread-out hotel", refers to a hotel located in ancient skilfully restored buildings in historic centres of Italian towns and villages. Aquae Sinis is a brand new "albergo diffuso" located in Cabras, a lively village in the Sinis peninsula. Three 17th century residences of the historic centre - Thermae, Mistras and Pontis have been elegantly restored in the traditional architectural style using bio-construction techniques. The results are dramatic: rooms have been designed to recreate the cosy and romantic feeling of the past, with just the right touch of modernity and technology. All the rooms are different, but they are all decorated in the distinctive Sardinian style: from the cane ceilings to the hand-decorated curtains. Rooms are equipped with high quality beds, 32-inch LED TV, minibar, free wifi.

On Arrival

The starting point of the tour is the village of Santu Lussurgiu. The nearest town to Santu Lussurgiu is Oristano. It is possible to reach Santu Lussurgiu from Oristano via bus. Oristano is linked to Alghero airport via shuttle bus, to Olbia or Cagliari via bus or train.

To reach Cagliari airport (CAG) from Cabras, you need to go to Oristano. You can either reach Oristano via private taxi (taxi ride is approximately 25eur) or via bus, please see section above.

From Oristano to Cagliari airport (CAG) you have then 2 different solutions:

- A. Shuttle bus from Oristano to Cagliari city centre, bus company Logudoro tours. Bus stop is in Via Cagliari in front of the ARST bus station. See timetable at: <http://www.logudorotours.it/wp-content/uploads/2017/01/ORARI-AUTOLINEA-CAGLIARI-APT-ALGHERO.pdf>

From Cagliari you can catch a train to the airport, several services a day, takes about 7 minutes.

Travelling by car - Logistics

In Sardinia there are no tolls to be paid for the highways.

From Porto Torres or Alghero via SS131, direction Cagliari, leave highway at intersection "Santu Lussurgiu" and follow indication to the village.

From Olbia via SS131 direction Cagliari/Sassari. At the end of the SS131 follow directions to Sassari entering the highway SS131. Leave the highway at intersection "Santu Lussurgiu" and follow indication to the village.

From Cagliari via SS131 direction Oristano/Sassari, leave highway at intersection "Santu Lussurgiu" and follow indication to the village.

The hotel in Santu Lussurgiu is located in the very heart of the village, you can reach the property only through extremely narrow cobbled streets with very limited parking. If you are planning to drive to



Sardinia, we suggest to leave your car at tour end (Cabras) and travel to Santu Lussurgiu by public transportation (no direct service, travel by bus via Oristano) or book a transfer with our organization (rate: 35eur per person, min 2pax).

If you park your car at the start in Santu Lussurgiu: the hotel Antica Dimora del Gruccione does not have a private parking. You can leave your car in public parking spaces, no fees required.

If you park your car at the end of the tour Cabras: the hotel Villa Canu does not have a private parking. You can leave your car on the street in public parking spaces, no fees required.
